CAMPING RULES & REQUIREMENTS

*please note: a need for more wood or ice is NOT considered an emergency

ARRIVAL:

- Check-in begins at 2:00 pm (you may enter the park prior to site check-in).
- Stop at gate house to:
 - Receive lock box code/camper key for gate key (in case of an after hours emergency).
 - Confirm final camper/visitor numbers & pay outstanding balances with cash, debit card, credit card.
 - Parking permit for your vehicle staying overnight (display on dash at all times).
- Purchase ice and firewood if not pre-ordered.

DURING YOUR STAY:

- If you leave the park, upon re-entry you must stop at the gatehouse to show your overnight parking permit.
- Valid receipt allows free entry into the other 5 Conservation Halton parks.
- All campsite reservations require a person 21 years of age or older at the time of processing. This person must occupy the site for the duration of the camping permit. Proof of age may be requested.
- Ratios must be maintained:
 - Group supervision: 1:10.
 - Groups of children 4 and under, minimum supervision of 1:3 required.
- Camping in natural areas comes with inherent risks.
- Group leaders are responsible for the control & discipline of group members.
- Trails follow the escarpment cliff edge with no barriers. Please use caution when hiking.
- In the event of an emergency, please report all details to park staff immediately.
- Swimming (Kelso): only permitted at the beach area, and when unsupervised, is at your own risk.
- Winter camping (Rattlesnake Point): limited vehicle and facilities access(ask at time of booking).

DEPARTURE:

- Vacate campsite by 12:00 pm on your last day. You may remain in park until closing time.
- Extinguish camp fire. Dispose of garbage in bins.
- Charges will apply to sites requiring clean-up or turf/site repairs.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Please obey Rules & Regulations posted throughout the area.
- Alcohol prohibited. Failure to comply will result in charges and/or eviction without refund.
- All pets must be on a max 2 metre leash. Clean up after your pet. Dogs prohibited in the Kelso beach area.
- Campers must not damage, destroy or remove any property, plants, animals or natural objects in/from conservation areas. This includes the cutting of live branches and the use of dead wood for firewood.
- No firewood/wood product to be brought into the parks to avoid the spread of Asian Long Horn Beetle & Ash Borer.
- Open fires restricted to fire rings and barbecues.
- If recreational climbing, no ropes on any cliff face prior to gatehouse opening.
- At the seasonally posted closing time, campers must return to their campsite.
- All park and camper day use visitors must vacate the area at the seasonally posted closing time.
- Quiet hours from 11:00 pm to 8:00 am. Campers must remain on their campsite after dark.
- Firearms and fireworks prohibited.

*Please ensure that everyone in your group is aware of Conservation Halton's policies and regulations.
